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#### **Red Group;**

##### **Question 1**

1. Orthodox – training and educating for country to which they are sent
2. Send overseas
3. Frequent contact in parishes where there are migrants and learn to appreciate other cultures

#### Question 1

- Catholic Immigration Office should organise Chaplains to go to seminary as a regular thing e.g. every two months – regular part of syllabus.

#### Question 2

- Problem across dioceses: sick calls
- Across parishes, priests accept de facto
- Change needs good reason.

#### Question 3

Church Calendar

Spanish -14 nations: Marian – can have 50 apparitions so better to have one of South American countries – imm. Jealousy/division.

Maltese – 15-25 feasts

Croatia – level

African – St. Daniel Ktobe? But didn't have a priest

Difficulty of 'Sudanese' priest.

For Australia, what criteria could be put in place for national feasts? How to decide which nations?

#### Question 4

Decisions: Good to have trained decision but difficult for deacon to work together with priest; particular problem if deacons is there first.

Need education on the role of deacon. Shortage of priests will require it. Problems with current situation – money a big factor. Parramatta – Filipino married deacon works well.

### **Purple Group;**

#### Question 1

About the Seminarians

It is very important to introduce the seminarians to the reality of their future work in parishes around Australia.

One priest in our group – originally from Vietnam – had pastoral experience in parishes when he was still a seminarian.



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Seminarians should have more experience in parishes. They should as well learn a second and third language.

It is important to know how to greet people in their cultural way. Sometimes, gestures are more affective than words. Communication is more than language.

Learning the language is not enough. The seminarians should also learn about the reality of migration in Australia.

### Question 3

Devotions should be encouraged and they help different cultures to come together. If not in Australian calendar, at least at the parish level, the parish priest should know and encourage the devotions of the different groups.

### **Orange Group;**

#### Question 1
